




Message from Head of Centre

Our Inset days for staff on Monday 13th and Tuesday 14th April were Forest School Skills for Staff who work in the classrooms and Family Services. As I mentioned in a previous Newsletter we have been completing a BTEC Level 2 in Forest School Skills to further improve our work with the children on our Woodland days. Non contact staff were involved with Manual Handling and Fire Marshall training.

Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP)

You may have heard about Pupil Premium or Early Years Pupil Premium. EYPP came into force from April 2015 for eligible 3 and 4 year old children accessing funded education. Nurseries, schools, childminders and other childcare providers are now able to claim extra funding through the Early Years Pupil Premium to support children's development, learning and care. We can use the extra funding in any way we choose to improve the quality of the early years education that we provide for eligible children. This could include for example additional training for our staff on early language, investing or supporting our staff in working on specialised areas such as speech and language.

It is well documented that high quality early education can influence how well a child does at both primary and secondary school so we do want to make the most of this additional funding. You may be aware if you have older children that a pupil premium has been available for school age children and it has proved to have given a real boost to the children receiving the funding. We want to do the same for our early years children entitled to this funding. Thank you for completing forms regarding this and we will be publishing information regarding how this terms funding has been spent later in the year.

Butterfly Class

Welcome back and we hope you have been enjoying the recent good weather! This term our core story has changed to The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle and you will be able to see the beginnings of the work we have been doing on our topic wall. Children will be learning the story and retelling it using props and puppets. Through this topic we shall explore the concepts of growing, life cycles and healthy eating. We will be watching caterpillars growing into butterflies and keeping a watch on the tadpoles in our Woodland pond!

At the moment we are encouraging our children to be as independent as possible and so supporting your child's dressing and name writing skills at home will really help this. Buzzybee Class

Our current core story in the Buzzy Bees is The Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle. The children will be looking at the days of the week, number, cycle of the butterfly and tasting fruits from the story. We also hope to be getting some live caterpillars so they can see the real lifecycle of a caterpillar to butterfly.

The children have also shown an interest in weddings, so as you may have already noticed we have added wedding outfits including many bridesmaid dresses and waistcoats to our role play area for the children to wear and extend their play further.

As the weather is warming the children are accessing the outdoors much more regularly and have been enjoying the use of the bikes and water play. Please could we remind you bring a named sunhat and sunscreen for your child.

LadyBird Class

We have been learning about growing in the Ladybirds. So far, we have grown sunflowers on Woodland day and been growing cress in the classroom. We had some yummy cress sandwiches! Please take some seeds from the class whiteboard to plant at home.

After half term, we will continue this theme with our new core story – The Very Hungry Caterpillar. We will try some hungry caterpillar fruits and make a fruit salad. Please remember to bring sunscreen and a hat in for your child. The weather at this time is changeable and if sunscreen is available, we can apply this if it becomes sunny.

Don't forget to register your account on ParentMail and ensure you have a mobile number listed too as this will be the quickest way of sending urgent messages to you about the nursery.

Regular attendance;

Attending school **every day** is very important. Even a short time of absence from school can mean that a child misses out on a significant part of the curriculum, which can impact on their learning. Ofsted always ask for the school's attendance data. We monitor each child's attendance and absence record and you will receive copies of this information. If your child is ill and will not be attending school please telephone the school on the day of absence to inform us.

In the classrooms, **each child has their own pigeonhole for information**, letters etc so please remember to check these every day that your child attends nursery as there may be something important in there for you.

We also use a **whiteboard outside each classroom** to let you know about things that are going on in the nursery and your child's room.

Lunches

Please let us know if your child will be absent from nursery and therefore not be in for lunch by 9.15am as this helps to prevent waste.

You will be charged for the lunch if we do not receive notice in time.

If you walk to nursery and bring a pushchair or perhaps your child likes to ride their bike or scooter, we do have locks available. You can then securely leave items at the front of the nursery in the 'buggy park'. These are available at reception so please ask.
