Classrooms







Butterfly class: Our core story for Butterfly class this half term is 'It was a Cold Dark Night' by Tim Hopgood. The children have been listening to this story, talking about the pictures and the characters so they are becoming really familiar with it. We have a tuff tray with the characters and small world props so the children can use them to retell the journey of Ned the hedgehog as he looks for a home.

The children have been exploring the characters in the story through different art and craft activities including drawing, painting, clay, play dough, winding wool and pegging pegs onto cardboard hedgehogs.

We have learnt about Diwali - the festival of Light as the children made Rangoli patterns using rice and chalk as well as trying some food for snack like rice, shukaar paarah, mango chutney and naan bread. We watched how a family celebrated Diwali on CBeebies and learnt a song about a Diva lamp burning bright. We watched some fireworks on our Interactive White Board and made some different firework pictures from paint to learn about Bonfire Night. We sang a couple of songs about fireworks including 'On Bonfire Night'. Then we made red and purple poppies to add to our nursery Remembrance wall and tried really hard to keep quiet for two minutes on Friday 11th November at 11 o'clock. The children went on a Pudsey Ramble for Children in Need and looked around nursery for the characters — Pudsey and Blush. We made bear biscuits and a bear face for snack from a half of a pancake, banana slices for ears and raisins for its eyes and nose.

The children have been enjoying playing outside in all weathers and especially in the rain lately so thank you for sending in spare clothes, coats and wellies. Jumping and playing in puddles has been particularly enjoyable for all of them!

Woodland Julie has been busy supporting us and the children with playing in the Woodland garden as we have cooked soup and heated water over a fire to make hot chocolate. We have learnt how to keep safe around a fire, used hammers to crush chalk to make paint, hammered nails into pieces of wood, collected sticks, played in the mud kitchen, dug for worms and used the wheelbarrows to name just a few exciting activities the children have experienced. Our Butterfly class sing-a-long is Tuesday 13th December at 9.30am or 2.15pm. Our Christmas party is on Tuesday 20th December so remember to dress up.

Ladybird class: Our core story for Ladybird class this half term is 'Old MacDonald'.

The children have been enjoing listening to the story and using the small world tuff tray to explore the animals and their sounds. They have also enjoyed singing the song and dressing up as farm animals in the outdoor area.

We also began the half term learning about Bonfire night. We have made our own fireworks pictures, using the salad spinner and paints, practising our fine motor skills to turn the handle. We have also been making fireworks noises in our play, playing with sounds and exploring words! We also celebrated Diwali and drew Rangoli patterns in our mark making and read a story about the festival. The children also enjoyed our Pudsey Ramble for children in Need, and excitedly drew Pudsey's to bring home.

As the weather has changed we have begun to explore the season in our garden. We will begin visiting the woodland garden before the end of this term in preparation for woodland days next half term. Could we please remind parents to pack plenty of spare warm clothes, a warm coat, hat and gloves.

As we move into December we shall be learning about Christmas and getting ready for our Sing-a-longs by practising our songs. Each child shall receive a song book and we shall post the songs to Tapestry. Could we please ask that these are shared at home ready for us all to sing together!

Buzzy Bee class:

Our core story for the Buzzy Bees this half term is 'The Three Little Pigs', and it's been going down a storm! The children have been thoroughly enjoying listening to this story, talking about the characters so they are becoming really familiar with it, being able to retell parts of the story using storyboards, props and role play outfits. We have turned our role play corner into the third little pigs house, which the children are using to re-enact the story too. The children have been exploring the characters in the story through different art and craft activities including drawing, painting, clay, play dough, and more.

We have learnt about Diwali - the festival of Light, the children made Rangoli patterns using rice and chalk as well as trying some food for snack like chapati, mango chutney and some traditional sweets. We watched how a family celebrated Diwali on CBeebies and learnt a song about a Diva lamp burning bright. We watched some fireworks on our Interactive White Board and made some different firework pictures from paint to learn about Bonfire Night. We sang a couple of songs about fireworks including 'On Bonfire Night'. For Remembrance Day we joined together with the Butterflies and made red and purple poppies to add to our nursery Remembrance wall and tried really hard to keep quiet for two minutes on Friday 11th November at 11 o'clock. The children went on a Pudsey Ramble for Children in Need and looked around nursery for the characters — Pudsey and Blush. Some of the children made bear biscuits, we had lots of spotty pictures being made using painter dobbers, and had yellow playdough to make our own Pudsey bears.

The children have been enjoying playing outside in all weathers and especially in the rain lately so thank you for sending in spare clothes, coats and wellies. Jumping and playing in puddles has been particularly enjoyable for all of them!

Woodland Julie has led some amazing Woodland day experiences in our Woodland Garden. To name just a few of the things we have been up to; making mini firework inspired explosions using vinegar and baking soda in the mud kitchen, learning how to keep safe using tools, such as using hammers hit golf tees into pumpkins, we've collected sticks, played in the mud kitchen, dug for worms, used the wheelbarrows and become really muddy in the digging pit!!

Knowledge Organisers

The Knowledge Organisers are created by the class teams to support children, practitioners and families. They display our key words, stories, suggested texts, songs and rhymes that every child will have some experience of over the course of a half term. They reflect the age and stage of the children within each room with aspirational outcomes in mind for all children. They are visual to encourage children's engagement. Key vocabulary is displayed in the classrooms, at the children's height with pictures to aid children's interaction.


We have selected key vocabulary linked with the core story and theme which we would like the children to know and understand. We also carefully select nursery rhymes to support children's language, number, fine and gross motor skills. The nursery rhymes may also link with the core story, theme or season of the year.

In support of the core story/theme/season we name a collection of suggested texts within our Knowledge Organisers. Suggested texts may include traditional tales, non-fiction, fiction, diversity, comics/magazines, atlas, maps, fliers, touchy feely, music/sound books, sensory stories, finger/hand puppet books, popular culture. These will be available for children and practitioners to access within the classroom/library.

The Knowledge Organisers will be sent home for you to share with your children in support of learning happening in school. Core Stories and nursery rhymes will be shared on Tapestry for you to share together at home.
