Buzzy Bees;

We are currently enjoying the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, the children are role playing the different characters within the home corner, which has been turned into the Giant's house. We have sown various seeds in our vegetable patch, including the bean they have taken home. Next half term continuing with the growth theme we shall also be looking at the story The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle, looking closely at the cycle of the Caterpillar to Butterfly.

We are going to start looking at different pieces of art work and the artists who create them, finding out information on how and what they used to create their art work, as well as information about the artist themselves. We are starting with the painting 'Squares with concentric circles' by Wassily Kandinsky.

Butterflies;

Butterfly class will be looking at and sharing the rhyming story of 'Duck in the Truck' by Jez Alborough as our core story this half term. We have had a real live duck come and visit us so we can learn more about ducks. The children will be matching objects that rhyme including duck and truck, singing songs including 'Old MacDonald' and 'Five Little Ducks' as well as looking at different types of vegetables. We are looking forward to continuing our Woodland days this term so we play with mud just like the duck from our story 'Duck in the Truck'. Our new day is Tuesday so please remember to bring your child's wellington boots and a coat. We will be playing in the mud kitchen, looking at the trees, digging in the digging area, bird watching, looking for signs of Summer, watering the plants, making mud faces and popcorn.

Ladybirds;

Over the next half term we shall be looking at the topics of Growing and Living Things. Our Core Stories shall be The Very Hungry Caterpillar and Jasper's Beanstalk. The children shall continue to plant and look after our vegetable patch in the Woodland garden and pick the produce to eat at snack times. We shall also be looking at how living things grow and focusing on the life cycle of a caterpillar, hopefully looking after some of our own!

As the weather gets warmer and children bring in their own hats or water play clothes, can we please ask you to name your child's clothing to ensure that we are able to return it to the right person when they have been changed. Thank you.

Summer's here!

Now the weather is starting to get warmer, we would like to remind parents/carers of how we can enjoy the sun safely.

At Caverstede Nursery School we plan activities to help reduce the impact of heat - such as ice in water play or the use of fans. We also use more shaded areas of the outdoor environment in extreme heat, provide drinking water throughout the day and encourage children to stay hydrated. We are mindful that the sun is particularly damaging between the hours of 11am and 3pm.

We ask that parents;

- provide sunscreen of Factor 15 and above for their child.
- sign a label giving staff permission to apply sunscreen to their child and this will be fixed to the bottle/container. Staff will apply sunscreen or support children to apply their own and will re-apply if children are in nursery all day.
- provide their child with a sun hat - named, to wear in the nursery garden. We do have some Legionnaires hats available to buy at reception. These cost £2 each

To ensure that your child stays safe in the sun whilst at Caverstede, they will unfortunately remain inside if sunscreen is not provided by parents/carers.
